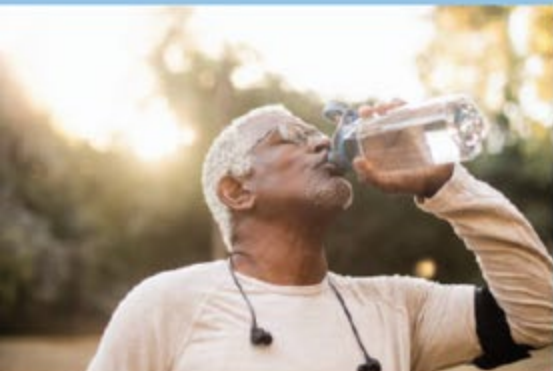

Current FUEL-3 Policy

Policy FUEL-3 states that:

- The local Source Protection Authority shall request from the Technical Standards and Safety Authority (TSSA) inspection reports on Private Fuel Outlets in areas where the handling and storage of fuel is a significant drinking water threat. To aid in the implementation of Part IV policies, the TSSA will provide this information to the Source Protection Authority for distribution to Risk Management Officials. The local source protection authority will report back to TSSA any data about leaks and other concerns observed, as they relate to TSSA's mandate to enforce Ore 213/217 (as amended).

Challenges

- Current policy directed at Source Protection Authority not the Technical Standards and Safety Authority (TSSA) or a Ministry and is not legally binding
- Most years we do not receive a reply when we reach out
- When we do, it is clear they have not done many relevant inspections
- Policy reported implemented even in year we receive no data





Options

- Other Source Protection Regions have policies directed at Technical Standards and Safety Authority (TSSA) and the Ministry they work with
 - They included information about any relevant inspections within the annual reporting process
- There is also an option to request that they prioritize inspections in source water vulnerable areas and see if there is any push back during consultation

Proposed replacement policy

***NEW* FUEL-3:**

- By February 1st of each year the Technical Standards and Safety Authority (TSSA) and the Ministry of Public and Business Service Delivery and Procurement shall report on the number of inspections of fuel sites where the handling and storage of fuel would be considered a significant drinking water threat. TSSA is also encouraged to prioritize inspections in these vulnerable areas where fuel could be considered a significant threat.
